

## Fishing License Requirements

Everyone must have a valid fishing license in their possession while fishing, except:

**You do not need a fishing license if you are:**

- Under the Age of 16
- Fishing on a licensed fishing preserve
- Fishing during the free fishing weekend
- Fishing at a free fishing clinic
- A resident landowner primarily engaged in farming (including lessees and members of their immediate families) when fishing on farm lands they are occupying and cultivating.
- A farm fish pond license holder (including members of their immediate families) fishing on waters covered by the license.
- A Native American living and fishing on reservation land.
- A patient residing at a qualifying U.S. Veterans Administration hospital or facility in New York State.

### Free/Reduced Fee & Lifetime Licenses:

**Free/Reduced Fee Licenses** (military, legally blind, Native Americans, students)

An annual fishing license is available for free or a reduced fee to select groups meeting specific qualifications. Please review qualifications and how to get your license by visiting the link below.

**Lifetime License** Fish for life with a lifetime license! Available to New York residents only.
