Fishing License Requirements

Everyone must have a valid fishing license in their possession while fishing, except:

You do not need a fishing license if you are:

- Under the Age of 16
- · Fishing on a licensed fishing preserve
- · Fishing during the free fishing weekend
- Fishing at a free fishing clinic
- A resident landowner primarily engaged in farming (including lessees and members of their immediate families)
 when fishing on farm lands they are occupying and cultivating.
- A farm fish pond license holder (including members of their immediate families) fishing on waters covered by the license.
- A Native American living and fishing on reservation land.
- A patient residing at a qualifying U.S. Veterans Administration hospital or facility in New York State.
